

The Assistant Chief of Police assists and supports the Chief of Police in the overall management of operations for the UCI Police Department that includes UCI Campus and UCI Medical Center, and who assumes full command of the department in the absence of the Chief of Police.

The incumbent will be responsible for assisting the Chief with overseeing all operations within the department by providing leadership and goals/objectives related to, but not limited to, department policies/protocols, staff development/training, performance management, emergency management, projects and related benchmarks, community/media relations, and coordination with Campus and Medical Center leaders/stakeholders.

Special Conditions

- Background Investigation
- Daily functions may require wearing a uniform and as directed
- Must be available to work rotating or alternate shifts in all weather conditions and for extended periods of time during periods of disaster or civil disorder
- Possession of a valid California Class C driver's license and be enrolled into the Department of Motor Vehicles Employer Pull Notice (EPN) Program Notification system

Essential Requirements
