Chief of Police

A national search is currently underway to attract highly qualified candidates for an exciting opportunity to lead the University of California, Los Angeles, Police Department (UCLA PD). Reporting to the Administrative Vice Chancellor, the Chief of Police is responsible for providing management and leadership to the UCLA PD. With a budget of \$16.5 million, the UCLA PD has 64 sworn officers, 46 civilian employees, and approximately 100 part-time students. The Chief of Police is responsible for managing, planning, and directing the law enforcement activities associated with the main campus, four hospitals, and several off-campus clinics and buildings. The Chief of Police is also responsible for UCLA's nationally recognized Emergency Medical Services program and the Community Service Officer program.

A Bachelor's degree is required; Master's degree is preferred. Other advanced executive level training or graduation from the FBI National Academy may be a plus. Candidates should have 10 years of progressively responsible law enforcement experience including 5 years of recent management and administrative responsibility experience. The successful candidate must be a sworn peace officer with either a California POST Management certificate or have the ability to obtain certification within 1 year of employment and must commit to obtaining an Executive POST certification within 30 months of hire. Must be able to obtain FBI Secret Clearance or higher.

This at-will position has a very competitive budgeted salary range of \$290,000 to \$330,000+ based on skills, knowledge, and experience. UCLA offers an excellent benefits package. Additionally, moving and relocation assistance may be offered to the selected candidate within UCLA's established guidelines. This benefit may also include approval for temporary housing during the first month of employment up to \$5,400.
